



ANGIOR FAMILY FOUNDATION GRANT GUIDELINES

The Angior Family Foundation

The Angior Family Foundation (the Foundation) is a Perpetual Charitable Trust established in 2001 in Victoria by the will of the late Leonard Holmes Angior. Since its inception, the Trust has distributed over \$6 million in grants for charitable purposes in Victoria. Australian Executor Trustees Limited (AET L) is the trustee and works closely with an independent Advisory Board who are guided by the wishes of the Foundation's founder, Leonard Holmes Angior.

Funding focus and Grant Criteria:

- 1. The Anglican Church of Australia Trust Corporation for the Diocese of Melbourne;**
- 2. Charities having, as their main purpose, the support of performing arts in Victoria:**

The Foundation will consider applications from eligible organisations:

- To Support cultural institutions and organisations in Victoria which are distinctive in artistic achievement, imagination and innovation;
- To promote access, engagement and preservation of Victoria's history, art and culture;
- To extend cultural opportunities to regional centres, and encourage the development of arts programs at a local level

- 3. Authorised charities engaged in the provision of medical services or in medical research:**

The Foundation will consider applications from eligible organisations to support the provision of equipment and capital infrastructure with focus on the disadvantaged, disabled or those suffering from long term, life threatening illnesses;

- *The need for the equipment should be essential;*
- *It should be durable for use over a period of time and will benefit a large number of people;*
- *Where possible, to be considered a community asset, equipment must be accessible to a wide range of people;*
- *Funding is NOT provided for equipment where that equipment forms part of mandatory requirements to meet industry certifications or accreditations;*
- *Where appropriate, the organisation may be required to provide a maintenance plan and/or proof of the capacity to insure or maintain the equipment after purchase*

Eligibility



The Foundation can only consider requests from organisations that:

- Based in Victoria or who will use the grant primarily for the benefit of Victorians;
- Have an ABN (Australian Business Number);
- Registered with the ACNC
- Deductible Gift Recipient level 1 (DGR1); and
- Tax Concession Charity (TCC)

Grant exclusions

The Trust does NOT make grants for the following purposes:

- To or on behalf of individuals
- Capital fund-raising for major building purchase, construction and maintenance works
- General fund raising appeals
- Motor vehicles and buses
- Sport, recreation or social activities for their own sake
- Scholarships and bursaries
- Arts projects for art's sake - however, the Trust will consider arts initiatives that support public education or that facilitate the improvement of social outcomes
- Provision of health and medical services already provided by Public Agencies;
- Protection and welfare of domestic animals
